

Peru – Machu Picchu & Manu Road 24 days – November 2015**Peru Birding Tours****Bird Guide: Jesus Cieza****Day by Day Activities****Day 03 (November 05th)**

After arriving and having a nice dinner a night before around Cusco. Today we headed to the train station in order to go to Aguas Calientes and be ready for Machu Picchu the next day. So we had an early trip to Aguas Calientes having time to do some birding around this small town that afternoon was good with some interesting birds like a juvenile Fasciated Tiger-Heron, Mitred Parakeet, White Bellied Hummingbird and a colorful Collared Inca.

Day 04 (November 06th)

Beautiful morning at Machu Picchu City with tons of pictures plus the endemic Inca Wren and Green and White Hummingbird. Some other like Tricolored Brush-Finch, Highland Motmot. A little rain stopped our birding and we had to take the train back to Ollantaytambo.

Day 05 (November 07th)

Early breakfast to do Abra Malaga for some high elevation birds such as Crested Duck, Andean Goose, Andean Lapwing and White-winged Cinclodes. Finally, back to Cusco.

Day 06 (November 08th)

Nice day at Huacarpay Lake with the endemic Rusty-Fronted Canastero and Bearded Mountaineer, Giant Hummingbird and a family of Yellow-Billed Pintail (female with 7 chicks). Then some stop on the way to Wayquecha Station for some birds like Rufous-Naped Ground Tyrant, Plumbeous Sierra Finch and Peruvian Sierra Finch.

Day 07 (November 09th)

Birding from Manu Road and around Wayquecha Station getting nice birds like White Throated Hawk, Shinning Sunbeam, the common resident Scarlet Bellied Mountain Tanager and Hooded Tanager. By the end that night the Uncommon White Throated Screech Owl.

Day 08 (November 10th)

The day was a little cloudy and we couldn't enjoy well but even like that we managed to get some birds like Rufous Capped Thornbill, Solitary Eagle, Rufous breasted Chat Tyrant, Andean Guan and others.

Day 09 (November 11th)

Early walk to try the endemic Red and White Antpitta being so close and not seen it (singing only). But we got some other birds on the way to Cock of the Rock Lodge like Barred Fruiteater plus Rust and Yellow Tanager nesting by the road. And before arriving to the Lodge a nice troop of Gray Woolly Monkeys.

Day 10 (November 12th)

Another early start to the fabulous Cock of the Rock Leek a bit rainy but we could see some Males displaying and flying around and a pretty Booted Racket-Tail join us in the Leek too. Some more birds that day like Mottle-Backed Elaenia, Paradise Tanager, Dusky Green Oropendola and White Capped Dipper.

Day 11 (November 13th)

we took an easy morning by enjoying the Hummingbird feeders and getting pictures of the lodge around. Nice pictures of Highland Motmot, Russet Backed Oropendola Silver Beaked Tanager and a welcome monkey troop of Brown Capuchin Monkey.

Later that afternoon a Little walk to get some more birds like Lemon Browed Flycatcher, Long Tailed Tyrant, Torrent Duck and a cool view of Rufescent Screech-Owl.

Day 12 (November 14th)

Early morning walks with some colorful tanagers like Golden Tanager, Yellow Throated Tanager, Beryl-Spangled Tanager and the spectacular Crested Quetzal. Then in the afternoon we got some more birds like Blue Necked Tanager, Speckled Chachalaca and Summer Tanager.

Day 13 (November 15th)

Good birding day with Orange-Eared Tanager, Golden Collared Honeycreeper, Orange-Bellied Euphonia. That day we visit our driver's house at Pilcopata town where we got some more birds like Amazon Kingfisher, Violaceous Jay, Red Capped Cardinal, social Flycatcher. Finally, we continued our trip to Amazonia Lodge, where we spent the afternoon taking pictures of the Hummer that visit the feeders there.

Day 14 (November 16th)

Another great day with a good view of Rufous Vented Ground Cuckoo, a very rare bird of Hilly forest. Some other birds like Black Tailed Tyrant, Red Throated Caracara, Black Tailed Trogon and Buff Rumped Warbler.

Day 15 (November 17th)

cool morning with White Throated Toucan, colorful Ringed Kingfisher, Blue Crowned Trogon. Rainy afternoon walks with some more birds like White Throated Antbird, White Eyed Parakeet and the Pretty Emerald Toucanet.

Day 16 (November 18th)

Our last morning at Amazonia Lodge and we went out for a morning walk getting a nice Rusty Belted Tapaculo, Gray Antwren and Buff Throated Woodpecker, then a very fresh boat ride to Pantiacolla Lodge then once at the Lodge there a short walk around with good birds like Broad Billed Motmot, Sulphury Flycatcher, Yellow Margined Flycatcher and by the end of the day a big flock of Olive Oropendola plus a family of Red Howler Monkey.

Day 17 (November 19th)

a cloudy day but with good birds like Blue Crowned Motmot and the uncommon Cream Colored Woodpecker, by the afternoon a lovely view of Long Tailed Potoo plus the Chick, Red Necked Woodpecker and another good bird Hairy Crested Antbird.

Day 18 (November 20th)

Last morning at Pantiacolla Lodge and we went for a walk getting a couple of Golden Collared Toucanet, wedge Billed Woodcreeper and another boat ride to the next stop Manu Wildlife Center and on the way we got a nice couple of Roseate Spoonbill, Black Caracara, giant Cowbird and Osprey. Once at the Lodge another walks getting Band Tailed Manakin, Pale Winged Trumpeter and later that day a cool view of Amazonian Owl and Crested Owl.

Day 19 (November 21th)

we visit the tower for some Canopy birds like Blue Dacnis, Crested Oropendola, Bare Necked Fruiteater and Casqued Oropendola. After lunch another walk inside getting some more birds like Plain Throated Antwren, Red Crowned Ant Tanager, Olive-Backed Foliage Gleaner and the colorful American Pigmy Kingfisher.

Day 20 (November 22th)

Nice early walk along Tapir Trail with good birds like Blue Backed Manakin, Royal Flycatcher, Scale Breasted Woodpecker. After lunch another walk to get a nice Leek of Band Tailed Manakin and some others birds like Spot Winged Antshrike, Cinnamon Throated Woodcreeper, Sirystes plus some Blue and Yellow Macaws flying around.

Day 21 (November 23th)

Having our last breakfast at Manu Wildlife Center to have a 30-minute boat ride to our last stop and Lodge Tambo Blanquillo, on the way we got White Banded Swallow, Large Billed Tern and Muscovy Duck. Once at the Lodge we visit Camungo Lake, great shot of juvenile Great Black Hawk, Purus Jacamar, Black Billed Seed Finch, Tui Parakeet and others.

Day 22 (November 24th)

a very early start to visit the beautiful Macaw Clay Lick, where we got some cool birds like Red and Green Macaw, Scarlet Macaw, Orange cheeked Parrot and some raptors like Slender Billed Kite and Crane Hawk.

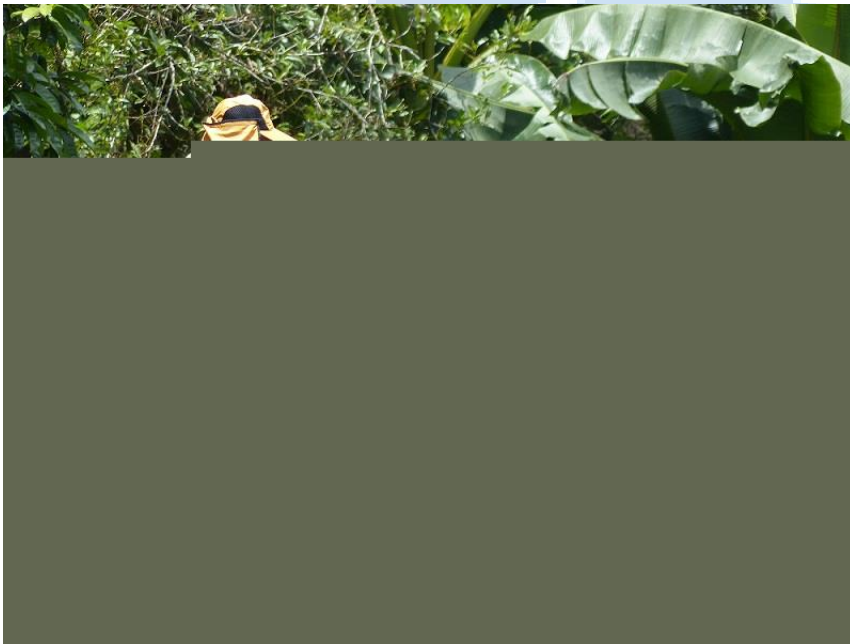
That day we got some news about the strike in Puerto Maldonado and we had to leave the place that afternoon to go to Puerto Maldonado.

Common at Wacarpay Lake, the SAAC says “ Hellmayr & Conover (1984) and many earlier classification treated andium (Andean teal) as a separated species from *A. flavirostris*. Many authors from Meyer de Schauensee (1970) to Dickinson (2003), have treated andium as a sub specie of *A. flavirostris*. *Anas andium* was considered a separate species from *Anas flavirostris* by Ridgely et al. (2001), and this was followed by Hilty (2003). SAAC proposal passed to recognize Andium as separate species. Jaramillo (2003) further suggested that the subspecies *oxyptera* may also deserve recognition as a separate species from *A. flavirostris*.

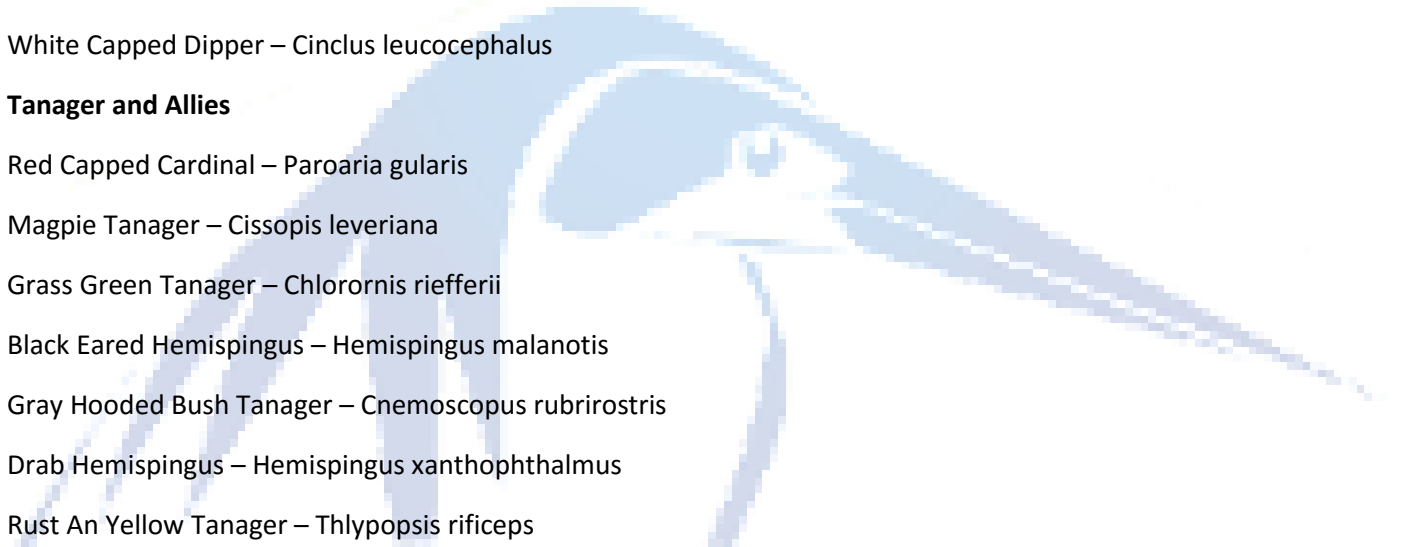
